Australia visa number format

The most common visa to visit Australia as a tourist is the Electronic Travel Authority (EEA). This allows most foreigners to stay in the country for three months at a time, as often as they want within 12 months. Some travelers can avoid eta's \$15 service charge by getting an eVisitor visa instead. This is only granted to those whose countries have strong ties to Australia and whose process takes longer. Other short-stay visas include a standard visitor visa (available for up to one year) and a working holiday visa designed to give young tourists fixed-term jobs during the trip. People from New Zealand do not need any visa to visit their island neighbour. For longer stays, Australia offers visas to students and employees, as well as permanent residence visas for sponsored employees and family members. Type of visa How long is it valid? Designed for those who do not meet the requirements of an eVisitor visa (only available to citizens of European countries), this is the most common tourist visa available to citizens of the UNITED STATES, Canada, the United Kingdom and 30 other countries listed on the Australian government website. ETA (Subcategory 601) is valid for tourist or business trips (including cruise ship up to three months, as often as desired within 12 months. Applicants must have a valid passport from the eligible country, meet the Australian Government's health requirements and only have to stay temporarily. Eta itself is free, but the charge is about \$15 (AUD 20) it must be applied for outside Australia and can be posted online. Arrival time is not extended. In order to stay longer, you need to apply for another EEA or a different visa . EEA applications can be submitted from any couple of days to a year before the trip. Let processing take 72 hours, but in most cases you will get a response in a few minutes. More than 30 European countries, including France, Italy, the United Kingdom, Germany, Spain and scandinavian countries, are allowed to obtain an eVisitor visa (Subcategory 651), which is basically a free version of the EEA. It can also be used for short-term studies and education. One important reason for applying for an EEA instead of an eVisitor visa is the processing time. In order to qualify, the applicant must have a valid passport in a qualifying country and have no tuberculosis or criminal conviction. The eVisitor visa is completely free. No application or service fees are required. It must be applied for outside Australia and can be posted online. Although EEAs are typically processed on the same day, it can take three days to several months to process eVisitor visas. According to the Australian Government , 90 % of applications are processed within nine months . It's best to apply for it a year before the trip. The eVisitor visa cannot be extended. A standard visitor visa (Subcategory 600) is a more comprehensive version of EEA and eVisitor visas. It can be issued for three, six or 12 months at a time, when it is only three . It is good for frequent visits and longer stays based on travel, family or business. The requirements and costs of a visitor visa – also called a tourist stream – vary depending on the circumstances. Business guests are only granted a three-month stay with a tourist stream, but family members can be granted 12 months. To apply, you must have a valid passport, enough funds to cover your trip and the intention to leave Australia after your visa expires. The cost of a visa varies: applying from Australia costs AUD 365 (\$260), applying outside Australia costs AUD 145 (\$100), applying for a business or a family visit costs \$100 and frequently picking up a travelling stream (which means you can get an unlimited three-month visit over 10 years) costs AUD 1065 (\$760). In some cases, sponsors (i.e. family members) may be asked to pay an additional guarantee. Processing can take from 10 days to four months. An Australian student visa (subcategory 500) is issued to children aged 6 and over for up to five years, depending on your enrolment . Applicants shall provide evidence of acceptance to an Australian overseas student health care (OSHC), unless you belong to the exemption category, and provide a so-called welfare arrangement (either(a legal guardian who has a visa to stay in Australia for studies or arrangements with your school) if you are under the age of 18. A student visa costs AUD 620 (\$445) and can be applied for online in Australia or beyond. It also covers all family members who come with you and allows students to work up to 40 hours a week while studying. The processing may take one to four months, depending on the circumstances. The student visa is not entitled to an extension. In order for a student to stay longer, they must apply for a second student visa. There are several different Australian visas available for potential employees. While a visitor visa allows non-citizens to stay in the country for three months on the starting point of business, it doesn't allow you to earn a salary from an Australian institution, as its work visa does. The three preferred options are a working holiday visa designed for 18-30-year-old passengers (35 Canadian, French and Irish citizens) on holiday and work in Australia for 12 months, a temporary work visa for skilled workers and a permanent work visa that requires employer sponsorship and grants permanent residency in Australia . Only passport holders from more than 40 eligible countries (including the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, the EU, Japan, South Korea, scandinavian countries and others) are eligible for the working holiday programme. Each country is offered a certain number of slots, so apps are randomly picked up from the pool. Documents required by the visa Fees When will it take to process the visa? How long can you stay here? There are more than 20 different adoption visas for relatives and the remaining relative visas, each with its own price and requirements. For couples, a partner visa costs about \$5,500 and requires proof of a relationship . It must be applied for in Australia and can take up to two years to process. A permanent visa offered to parents of Australian residents and citizens costs slightly less, \$4600, and must be applied for outside Australia . The Australian Government will not processing times because it can set a cap and queue. Transit visa (Subcategory 771) is short up to 72 hours. It is free, it can be easily searched online, and only requires a confirmed reservation and a valid visa. Passengers must apply for and obtain a transit visa outside Australia before being allowed into the country. Some travellers – such as the UNITED States, the United Kingdom, much of the EU, the United Arab Emirates, South Korea, Japan and parts of South America – do not need a transit visa to travel through Australia. It can take 4-15 days to process a visa . According to the Australian Government, visa overstays can be detained or removed from Australia and can also be charged for the cost of removal. If you have not had a valid visa when you leave Australia, the government may also refuse to grant you a visa for up to three years. EEA, eVisitor visas and standard visitor visas cannot be extended, but in most cases you can reapply for the same visa (for another fee). In the case of work holiday visas, the second and third visas (each valid for one year) may be issued to those who meet the agricultural labour requirements of the country. If you find out that your visa has expired or is expiring, you can also apply for a Bridging visa E (BVE)– an extension option. BVE is free and allows you to stay legally and temporarily in Australia while arranging travel from the country or waiting for another visa to be processed.
